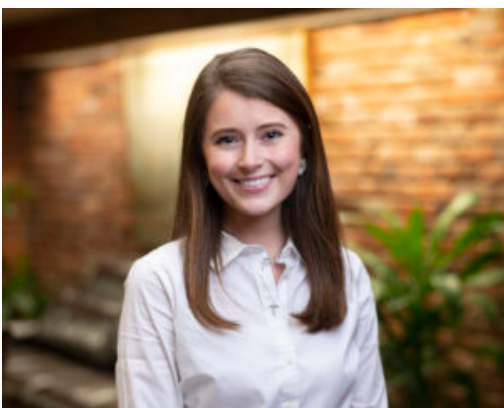
Virginia "Ginny" Bradley
